

## RECORD AMOUNT OF INHERITANCE TAXES ARE PAID

\$3,000,000 Estate of Local  
Utility Head Helps Swell  
Total.

More money in inheritance taxes  
was paid to the State of Indiana  
during the fiscal year which ended  
Sept. 30 than in any other year  
since the inheritance tax law was  
put into effect.

This was announced by Schulyer  
Mowrer, inheritance tax repre-  
sentative in the State tax board, to-  
day. Inheritance taxes for the year  
will be approximately \$1,130,000, as  
compared with \$885,000 for last year,  
according to Mowrer.

Estate taxes this year totaled 2-  
1/2 per cent, as compared with 2,906, for the  
year before, and they were valued  
between \$28,000,000 and \$69,000,000,  
as compared with \$67,816,567 for the  
year before.

The value of taxable estates was  
swelled by the death of Charles C.  
Perry of the Indianapolis Light and  
Heat Company and Crawford Fair-  
banks of Terre Haute.

Perry left an estate valued at  
\$3,590,278.57 and Crawford Fair-  
banks \$2,449,589.

Other large estates left in Marion  
County were those of Joseph D.  
Adams, \$642,000; John M. Shaw,  
\$29,805; Delavan Smith, \$690,573;  
William P. Junglausa, \$307,680.92,  
and Mary A. Dell, \$524,434.77.

other big shows.

Spotted Poland China classes and  
pass upon the boys and girls pigs en-  
tered in the Junior Feeding Contest.  
He is on the Animal Husbandry staff  
of the University.
