

CITY READY TO WHOOPEER UP AT MARDI GRAS

Stage Set for Greatest
Halloween Ever Held
Here.

The stage was set today for the greatest Halloween celebration ever held in Indianapolis.

Due to the wide publicity received by the Greater Indiana Mardi Gras celebration here Saturday night an attendance of 200,000 persons from over the State is expected, John F. Walker, general chairman, said.

Walker said the public has responded well and cooperated in making the program.

Festivities will begin at 5:30 p. m., when business men and civic leaders will attend the dinner at the Indianapolis Athletic Club. James M. Ogden, banquet chairman, who arranged the program, said there will be more than 250 present.

Mayor Shank, Senator Arthur R. Robinson and Frederick Van Nuys will be principal speakers.

Starts at 8 P. M.

At 8 p. m. the monster parade will start from Meridian and North Sts. Bells and whistles will be sounded for one minute before the hour. Following the parade through downtown streets will be judging of costumes and street dancing.

Lieut. Claude F. Johnson, parade marshal announced this route: From North and Meridian Sts. south on Meridian and around the west half of Monument Circle to Washington St.; West to Senate Ave., north to Market St.; west to Missouri St.; south to Washington and east on Washington St. to East St., where the parade will disband. Streets along the line will be closed to traffic. Lieutenant Johnson requests out-of-town visitors not to bring their automobiles into the downtown district. The parade will begin forming at 7 p. m.

To Occupy Stand

Mayor Shank and judges will occupy a stand on a special reviewing runway to be erected on the east side of Meridian between Monument Circle and Washington St. Blaine McGrath, chairman, Wallace O. Lee, Miss Mary Bostwick, William Herschell, and Volney B. Fowler, are judges.

A silver trophy donated by Harry O. Cobb, jeweler, will be presented the largest out-of-town delegations in the parade. Merchants have donated more than 100 prizes to be given participants in the parade.

For Street Dancing

Orchestras and bands will furnish music for street dancing.

Three airplanes under direction of Police Lieutenant Earl Halstead, have distributed more than 1,000,000 pieces of literature advertising the event. Practically every town in the State has been blanketed with advertising.

WFBM, Merchants Heat and Light Company broadcasting station, has announced the event. Fourteen other stations have given Hoosier programs. H. A. Luckey, radio chairman, said.
