

AUTO EARNINGS BREAK RECORD

Gain Is Surprise Even to Manufacturers.

NEW YORK, Nov. 2.—Manufacturers of both passenger and commercial motor vehicles are reporting record breaking earnings for the first nine months. With the recent prudent curtailment of production it seems assured that the last quarter will show an improvement over 1924, making the year the best on record says Motor in its weekly review of trade conditions.

Heavy as has been the demand for passenger cars, both at home and abroad, the truck and bus business has been even better. The total of 60,000 in September, establishing a new high mark for all time in a month which never before has been the biggest of the year, was a surprise even to manufacturers.
