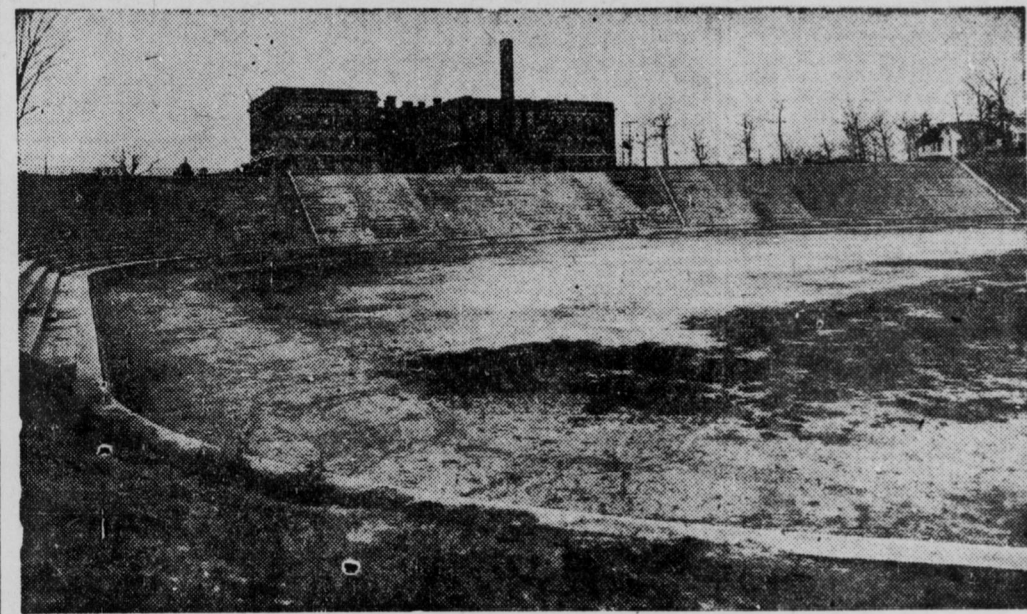

## Two High School Athletic Fields Are Nearly Completed at Evansville

the greatest set of high school athletic plants in the country.

The estimated value of the grounds and stadiums of the four high schools is set at \$400,000. Bond issues have been sold for the buildings and the incomes have made the plants self-supporting, according to Herbert Henderson, former Ohio State athlete, who is now business manager for the school board.

Central High School controls Bosse field, built several years ago as a community athletic field by the former mayor, and the Central League baseball team plays baseball there.

## City Will Have Great Set of Plants for Games.

With the construction work on the stadiums at Enlow Field, Bosse high school and Reitz Boys Catholic high school field rapidly nearing completion, Evansville is preparing to celebrate the ownership of probably

Seating capacity in the half circle is estimated at 15,000. All seats were filled last Saturday when Champaign, Ill., High School played here in the Central homecoming game.

### Beautifully Situated

Located on a hill in the west part of Evansville is Reitz Public High School. From the beautiful grounds all Evansville can be seen, as well part of Kentucky and the Ohio River. Directly in back of the school in the natural slope is the stadium. Concrete stands twenty rows high, built into the hill around half the oval seat 12,000 persons. They have been filled at city title games.

The million-dollar Catholic Boys' High School is building a stadium seating 15,000.

### Completing Stadium

The Bosse High School, already recognized as one of the most beautiful high schools in the country, is completing a stadium that will not detract from its reputation. An eight-foot brick wall, stoned coping, incloses the field. Running the length of one side, a huge concrete stand, built from the curb line to the playing field, will seat ten thousand persons. The stand is to be covered half way down to care for bad weather.

Arcades over the sidewalk and to the street allow auto loading and ticket sales out of the weather. A tunnel leads from the playing field to the high school, where dressing rooms, shower baths and swimming pool are part of the gymnasium equipment. The basketball court in the gym is said to be the largest in the State. The knockdown bleachers used in the gym can be moved to the stadium for big games.

### Backed by Banker

The stadium is called Enlow field. C. B. Enlow, known as the "Daddy of Athletics" in the high schools, is a member of the school board. Enlow, a leading banker of the town, has personally solicited bond issues, and funds for athletics. A recent drive netted \$2,000, to be used to outfit basketball teams in all the schools next spring. He said: "We members of the board always deal with every question in the light of 'will this be the best for the school children of Evansville?'"

Today the majority of the high school students of Evansville are insisting on college courses, and the number of grade school graduates who fail to enter high school has dropped to almost none.

### Both Escape

It was only a few months, however, before both bandits had escaped. Chapman was caught and brought back only to be freed again by the outside assistance of his friend, Anderson.

## DAM BURSTS; TEN MISSING

Lake Pours Into Valley, Carrying Away Dwellings.

LONDON, Nov. 3.—Flood waters in Lake Lyeelglaug at Dolgarrog, North Wales, burst through the dam there last night, pouring a great wave through the Conway valley and sweeping away numerous dwellings at Port Lloyd together with a bridge and a church.

A woman and her nine children are missing and believed drowned. The dam burst with roar that could be heard far through the valley and then came a series of terrific explosions which cut off electric lights in many towns. The dam formerly held back 15,000,000 gallons of water, but the lake had swollen, weakening the structure. As the waters rushed through the sleeping valley they carried with them hundreds of cattle and sheep.
