

## DRYS MEET IN 'BEER CAPITAL'

Anti-Saloon Convention  
Opens in Chicago.

CHICAGO, Nov. 5.—Forces of prohibition convened in Chicago today in the greatest rally for temperance and sobriety in the history of the Nation at the twenty-second national convention of the Anti-Saloon League of America. United States Senators, Congressmen, Governors, former Governors, preachers, business men and prohibition enthusiasts from all walks of life rubbed elbows in hotel lobbies and convention headquarters.

"The fight for prohibition has just begun. Our next battle is of perfect enforcement and promote observance. The flush of our first victory must not result in dropping the fight to the wets."

These were the slogans broadcast from convention headquarters.

For five days Chicago and environs as the "beer capital" for its beer runners, bootleggers, alcohol merchants and gunmen, becomes the dry capital of the country.

The executive committee, of which the Rev. W. B. Farmer, Indianapolis, is a member, went into session behind closed doors this morning.

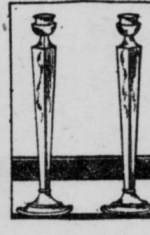
