

INDIAN SUMMER FAILS TO COME

Fall Rains Are Disastrous to Many Crops.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 12.—What's happened to Indian Summer this year?

This question is being asked from the Rocky Mountains to the Atlantic Coast following a succession of rainy and cold weeks that have cost farmers thousands of dollars in delayed crop operations, to say nothing of turning gridirons into quagmires for nearly every big football game.

For five consecutive weeks, starting about Sept. 25, the weather has been unfavorable for farm work in the middle states. It was too cool and wet also in the New England states where there was considerable complaint of unharvested potatoes rotting.

From Tennessee eastward heavy rains the last week in October caused interruption to picking and ginning. Similar conditions prevailed in Texas, where the prospect for a top crop is still unfavorable, because of weevils and worms. Much better conditions prevailed during the last of October in Oklahoma and Arkansas, although the weather was rather cool.

The hardest hit sections of the country were southeastern Texas and Louisiana where in many sections the rainfall during the third week in October was eight inches above normal.
