

JUDGE TO GIVE SEARCH RULING

Collins to Pass On Legality of Search Warrants.

Criminal Judge James A. Collins today announced that he will be ready within a few days to make his ruling on the legality of search warrants and the powers of a police officer while serving such. This ruling will directly affect six persons who appealed from city court on blind tiger charges. Each was fined \$100 and costs and sentenced to thirty days in jail.

In each instance it was charged that the homes of these persons were illegally searched. It was contended that some of the warrants were obtained from a justice of peace and served in a township other than that in which the court is located. "This ruling will be final in my court, and will be used until the State Supreme Court rules otherwise," said Judge Collins.

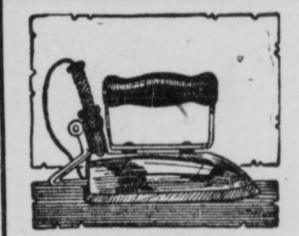

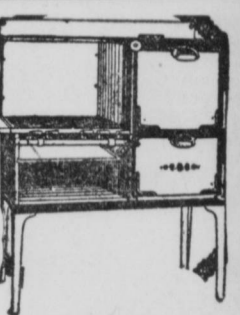

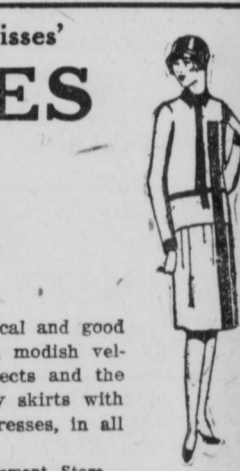
