Judge Clarence Dearth issued a restraining order to prevent the auditor from placing the increase in effect.

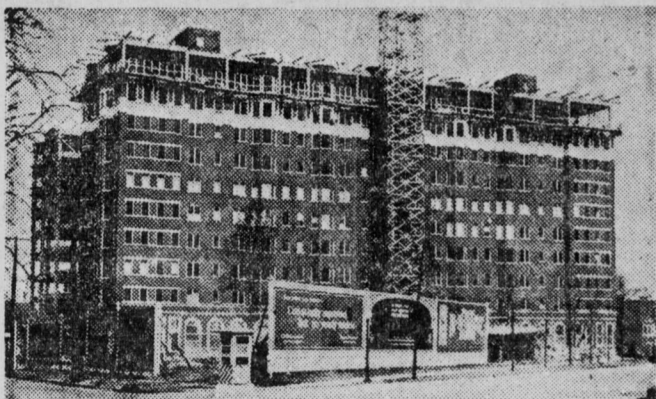
BUGGY MAY COST LIFE

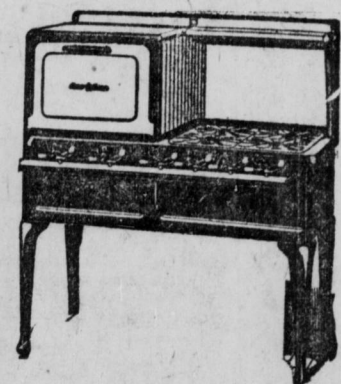
