State Board.



**TOTAL OF 583  
STATIONS NOW  
IN OPERATION**

Several Increase Power—  
Class B Reaches High  
Water Mark.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13.—The total number of Class B broadcasting stations reached a new high water mark with the transfer of WAFD, at Port Huron, Mich., from Class A to B. This brings the Class B total up to 114.

During the past month 21 stations were licensed, while only nine were discontinued. This brings the grand total of stations up to 583, 466 of which are Class A.

**Power Increased**  
Several stations increased their power during the month, taking advantage of the announcement of the Department of Commerce that increases in power could be made in more than 500-watt stages. Some of

the power increases during the month follow:

KPOA, Seattle, Wash., increased its power to 1,000 watts.

KPMQ, Fayetteville, Ark., increased its power to 750 watts.

WHO, Des Moines, increased its power to 5,000 watts.

WHT, Deerfield, increased its power to 2,000 watts.

WTAM, Cleveland, increased its power to 3,500 watts.

WTAS, Elgin, increased its power to 2,500 watts.


