

JUROR SUFFERS NERVE ATTACK

Collapses After Service in Stephenson Case.

NOBLESVILLE, Ind., Nov. 17.—Harley Huffman, one of the jurors that convicted D. C. Stephenson for the murder of Madge Oberholzer, collapsed after being discharged Saturday night and was in bed for two days, it became known today.

Huffman suffered a nervous breakdown, due to the long service in the trial, his physician said.

PRISON BLAST PLOT ALLEGED

Girl Expected to Make Denial of Scheme.

Complete denial of any connection in an alleged plot to blow up part of the penitentiary at Tucker, Ark., was expected today by Miss Inez Jewell, 26, former Midland, Ind., postmaster, indicted here by the Federal grand jury on charges of embezzling \$1,300 from the post office. She is being brought here from Chicago, where she and her mother, Mrs. Mary Jewell, said to have confessed a part in the alleged plot, had a hearing Monday before a United States commissioner.

Federal officials will attempt to prove that the embezzled money was used to further the plot. Mrs. Jewell sent four sticks of dynamite, two percussion caps and fuses to her son Boyd, serving life sentence in the Tucker penitentiary for murdering D. M. Stout, banker, Sulphur Springs, Ark. The packages were intercepted.

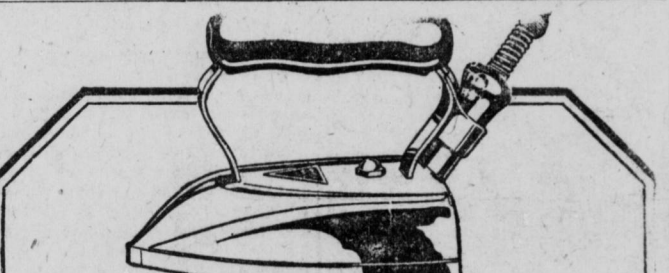
