

## JARDINE LAUDS WATERWAY PLAN

Cabinet Member Promises Aid to Hoover.

CHICAGO, Nov. 19.—Development of inland water ways in the Middle West would remove a distinct disadvantage in the matter of shipping facilities that now exists, Secretary of Agriculture, Jardine, here on a visit said. Jardine said he will cooperate with Secretary of Commerce Hoover in the inland waterways movement.

Even if railroad freight rates were reduced, Jardine said he did not believe Middle West farmers could compete favorably with farmers in sections that have ample waterway transportation.

Passengers of Lenape seeking simpler lives.

NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—After dramatic adventure on high seas, 366 survivors of the Clyde Liner Lenape today were scattering to havens where life is less ruggedly lived and much more comfortable.

Sixty-four passengers and men of the Lenape arrived here by special train. Another train took 165 of the passengers to Florida where the Lenape was bound from New York when it caught fire, thirty miles out, raced to port, and was grounded after all aboard were rescued.

## POLICE BAND BOOSTS CITY

Valuable Advertising Medium, Says Mayor.

The Police and Fireman's Band has proven a valuable advertising medium for Indianapolis, Mayor Shank said today.

The band is well equipped for street and concert work, having uniforms and instruments representing an investment of about \$7,000, all raised through concerts and dances.

It does not play for hire, and is available only for public purposes tending to promote civic welfare. William T. Bailey, assistant city attorney, is director.

Personnel includes police, firemen, city employees and others. They dominate their time. It is seldom police and firemen play in the band during hours they are on duty, Bailey said.

Commission to Determine if Bus Fare Boost Is Justified.


