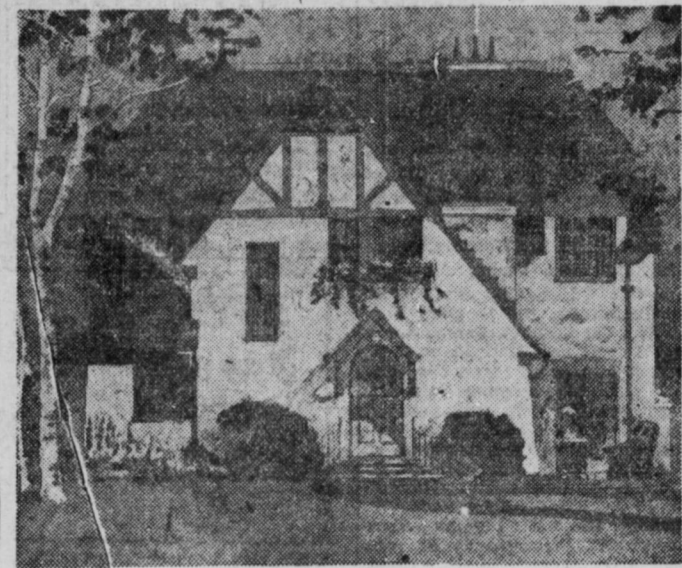

Antiquity of Architecture Adds Dignity to and Marks New Home



Home of Wayne W. Schmidt, 5745 Central Ave.

Quaint antiquity of architecture that fairly breathes the dignity of years behind and before it marks the new home of Wayne W. Schmidt, 5745 Central Ave., recently completed by Rodacker & Thornton, architects. The house is designed in old Anglo-Italian, finished on the exterior with rough pebble stucco and on the interior with quaint, rough interior stucco. The tall chimney with miniature smokestacks at the opening have some of the spirit of the Old English. The curving driveway and tiny vestibule entrance with artistic iron railing leading down the steps and with a flagstone terrace at the south corner lend beauty to the general distinction of the home.

The hall, entered from the small vestibule at the front has on the right a lavatory and large coat closet. Directly in front is the arched entrance and two steps down into the living room. To the left is the stairway with wrought iron railing.

The recessed windows in the thick walls of rough stucco, giving exposure on three sides of the living room, are graced by arches and the effect is carried through to the recessed book cases at the left of the entrance. A fireplace flush with the walls in framed with stone in carved design. The floors of this room are of hardwood finished in dark antique to resemble old wide plank floors. They correspond to the heavy beams in the high ceiling.

The dining room is approached by two steps from the living room and also has windows in three sides, the east side opening by French casement doors onto a terrace porch. The walls here are finished in the same rough stucco and the windows are hung with yellow Portuguese prints.

The dainty compact kitchen is painted in the unusual combination of lavender and buff and fairly bulges with cupboards and built-in cabinets. At one side the cupboards

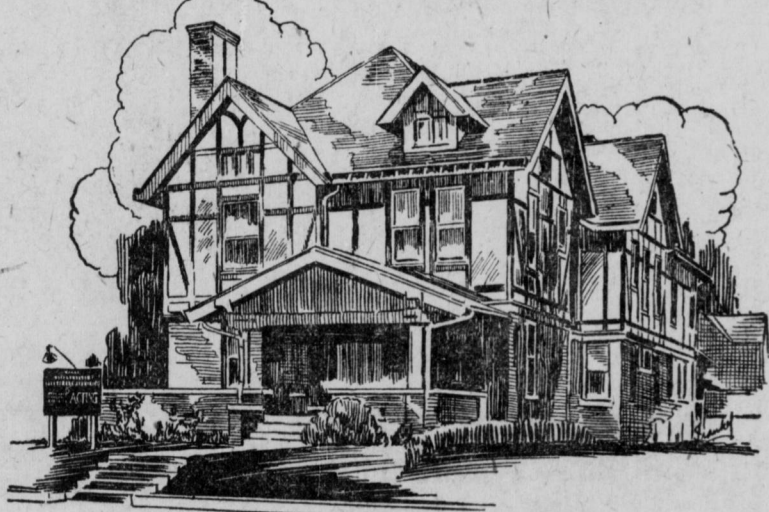
