

FISH PLANTING RECORD MADE, SAYS REPORT

Many Baby Black Bass and Bluegills Placed in Public Waters.

The division of fish and game of the State conservation department, broke a record this year in propagating and planting in the public waters of Indiana, baby black bass and bluegills, according to George H. Mannfeld, superintendent.

Mannfeld reported to the conservation director that the new hatchery at Avoca, in Lawrence County, in its first year of operation, produced many thousand more infant fish than anticipated, thus enabling the department to add thousands of stock fish to the usual year's output.

The report shows a total of 1,128,625 black bass and 348,854 bluegills propagated and planted. The total fish of all species produced and liberated in public waters, was 1,978,753. Aside from bass and bluegills, the department produced and planted 511,000 yellow perch, 32,000 rock bass, 29,800 crappie, 27,200 channel catfish and 1,874 yellow catfish. During the fiscal year that closed Sept. 30, wardens rescued 73,556 imperiled fish and replanted them.

The Avoca hatchery produced 55,387 black bass, both small and large-mouth, 33,250 bluegills, and 1,600 crappie.

State hatcheries are operated with a portion of funds received from hunting and fishing licenses. Stock fish are planted in public waters on application of local residents.

STATE SHIFTS MADE

Resignation of Bruene Brings Several Changes In Jobs.

With the resignation of Richard H. Bruene as head of the auto license department of the secretary of State's office, effective Dec. 1, a number of changes in State jobs is announced.

Bruene will be succeeded by Mark W. Rhoads, auditor of the State securities commission. Representative Frank E. Wright, Randolph county, who introduced the Bone-Dry bill in the last Legislature for the Anti-Saloon League, will take Rhoads' place. Earl Coble, Redkey, Ind., until recently investigator for the State fire marshal, may succeed Wright as securities commission investigator.

WILL TAKE BUS RIDE

Public Service Commission Inspector to See About Speed.

George Hutsell, inspector for the State public service commission, will make a trip from Indianapolis Wednesday to the Indiana-OHio State line in a bus of the Grandell Bus Line, operating to Cincinnati. The company wants to show the commission they are not violating the State speed law of thirty miles an hour for busses.

The commission recently ruled that four hours and thirty minutes should be the minimum time for the run to the Ohio line.

STATE JOB IS OPEN

Custodian to Become Sales Agent For Purchasing Committee.

Henry Roberts, Statehouse custodian, will become sales agent for the State joint purchasing committee Dec. 15, and the building and grounds committee, composed of the Governor, State auditor and secretary of State must get together on his successor. The job pays \$2,500 a year.

Benjamin Pierce, Indianapolis, employed in the State fire marshall's office, and reputed to have Klan support, is a strong contender. Others mentioned are Lon Henry Noblesville, Hamilton County chairman, and H. H. Witt, Lebanon.
