

STEPHENSON TO MAKE CHAIRS

Becomes Common Laborer at State Prison.

MICHIGAN CITY, Ind., Nov. 24.—D. C. Stephenson, the man who is reputed to have made more than a million dollars through organization of the Ku-Klux Klan, today became a common laborer in the Indiana State Prison here.

Stephenson sentenced to a life term when found guilty of the murder of Miss Madge Oberholzer, Indianapolis, has begun work in the prison chair factory.

Prison officials say it will be hard work.

At the same time Charles (One Arm) Wolfe, convicted of the slaying of Ben and Mary Hance, Muncie, and sentenced to life imprisonment began the tedious task of picking stray threads from completed garments in the shirt factory with his one hand.

Educational Features to Be Displayed at International Show.

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Nov. 24.—Purdue University will stage an educational exhibit at the International Grain and Hay Show in Chicago, Nov. 28 to Dec. 5, composed of several separate features. It will give

the results of recent experiments in fattening two-year-old steers and in breeding corn to produce pure strains of different varieties.

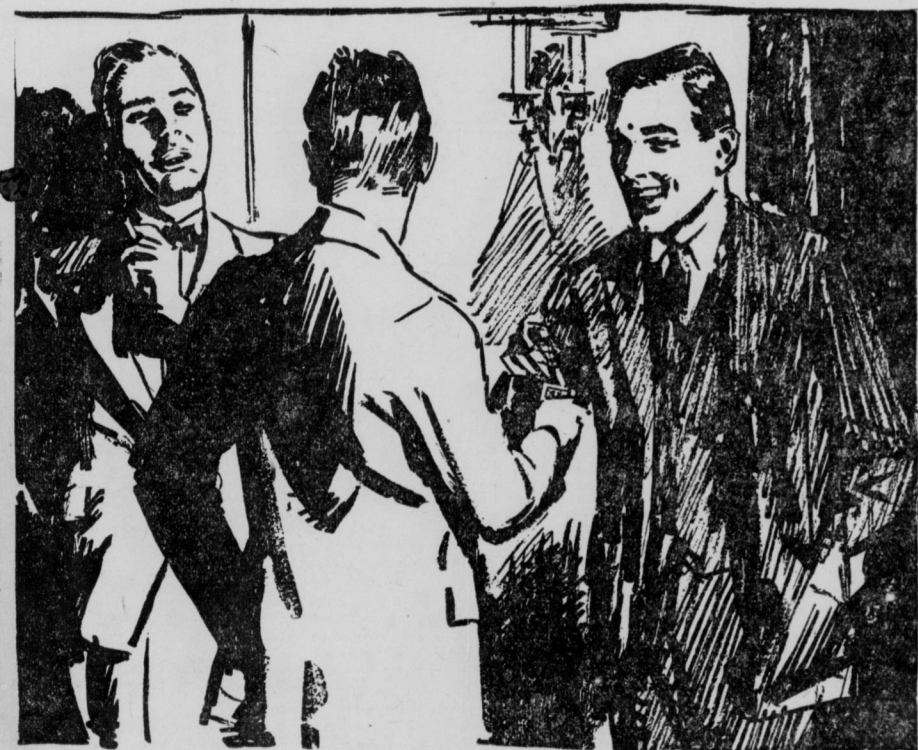

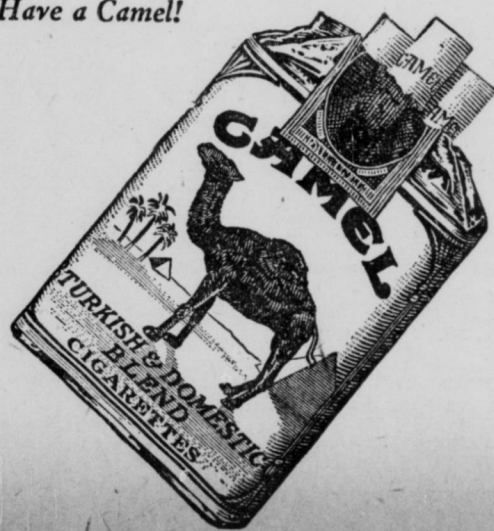
