

# EIGHT DETOURS LIFTED, SAYS ROAD REPORT

Some Run-Arounds May Re-  
main Until Spring Be-  
cause of Weather.

Eight detours and run-arounds on important State roads were lifted in the last few days with the opening of new pavement and bridges, it was pointed out in the State highway commission's traffic bulletin today.

But for unprecedented weather, which practically stopped construction at many points, virtually the entire program for this season should have been completed and roads now open, officials say. As it is, some detours necessarily must remain until spring. Conditions of roads entering Indianapolis:

No. 1 (New Albany, Indianapolis, South Bend, Michigan Line)—Detour just north of Peru account of bridge ditch. Detour from two miles north of Edinburg to Franklin account of bridge. Detour at Corydon account of bridge. Detour at Marshall, Marshall bridge unsafe for heavy traffic.

No. 3 (Richmond, Indianapolis, Terre Haute, Kentucky Line)—Detour at six miles west of Richmond, and run-around at one-half mile east of Pershing.

No. 6 (Madison, Greensburg, Indianapolis, Lafayette, Oxford)—Closed until about Dec. 15 to save over bridge at Traders' Point twelve miles west of Indianapolis; detour through Thonowalla to No. 6 side detour one and one-half miles north-west of Thonowalla, and short detour one mile further northwest.

No. 12 (Vincennes, Spencer, Indianapolis)—Drive carefully on bridge over temporary bridge two miles north of Gosport.

No. 22 (English, Paoli, Bedford, Bloomington, Martinsville, Indianapolis)—Closed at a point five miles south of Indianapolis for construction of overhead bridge. Detour is out S. Meridian road to No. 22, then on one mile of gravel road to No. 22. Closed between Martinsville and Bloomington, and English to Paoli for paving. Through traffic between Martinsville and Bloomington use No. 12 and 37. Closed at new bridge two miles south of Bedford. The local detour narrow, but in fair condition also a detour east from Bedford. No. 37 (Indianapolis, Anderson, Muncie, Ellettsburg, Iowa Line)—If workmen are building shoulders near Muncieville, then detour will be marked. Detour around bridge construction at Ingalls. Use old No. 11 at det. of 11 and 37 from two and one-half miles south of Pendleton to where old No. 11 intersects new State road. Drive this route carefully as shoulder work is still in progress. All along route. Bridge run-around at north edge of Yorktown.

No. 39 (Indianapolis, Rushville, Brookville, Ohio Line)—Run-around at Vanderburgh construction three miles south of Cedar Grove.

## DISTRIBUTION COST HIGH

Total Is 43.6 Per Cent of Amount Spent, Says University Head.

CHICAGO, Dec. 4.—Distribution costs absorb an average of 43.6 per cent of every dollar spent for purchases in the United States, according to President Jesse Grant Chapline of La Salle Extension University, in an address here.

"The ultimate consumer pays \$21, 800,000,000 for having goods brought to him, while the manufacturers and producers receive \$27,200,000,000 for making the goods, if we estimate our annual expenditure for consumable goods at fifty billions," said President Chapline. "As this average of 43.6 per cent distribution cost is calculated for virtually all classes of goods in daily use, it is about the same for the man with little to spend as it is for the man with a large income."
