

LIBERAL CHURCH GIVEN CREDIT BY LOCAL PASTOR

Rev. Line From His Pulpit
Answers Important
Question.

"The great questions of religion are stirring the hearts of men as never before," the Rev. Fred A. Line, pastor of the Central Universalist Church, said Sunday while preaching on "What Makes a Universalist?"

Continuing, the Rev. Line said: "Who and where and what is God? What is man's relation to God and what is His place in the world today?"

"Has the world outgrown the Bible? Is Christ a real and potent personality in the world's onward movement? Where is hell? What is hell? Who goes there and for how long? What is the final end of all effort and striving?"

"Today fewer men are riding in the band wagon of mere creedal profession, more are following along the way of Christlike service and life. To the liberal church more than to any other is due the credit of lifting Christianity from a purposeless, lifeless sectarianism to a vital life-giving progressive force."

"Who are these Universalists? The answer comes back, 'They are the people who don't believe in hell.' My friends, don't you believe it for a moment. We do believe in hell, not the old-fashioned orthodox lake of burning brimstone, but a hell in accord with the dictates of reason and human experience."

ship of Jesus Christ, the power of his personality as a guiding and directing influence in the world today. "He does not believe that Christ substituted his sufferings for the sufferings for man's, but that the pathway trodden by the Master is the pathway which must be followed by every man who would find God in fullness of life."

"Jesus is not a scapegoat for sinful man, but a co-laborer in the vineyard of love, who, by the beauty and power of His life shows man how to prove himself as a son of God."

"The Universalist believes in the Bible, not as to its infallibility or its verbal inspiration or its literal accuracy, but as the great book of religion, the inspirational source of truth and light and love and life, to be used by man as an aid in the great work of character building."

Belief in Hell

"The Universalist believes in hell. He believes that you can't buy your way out with a \$5 bill or a \$500 rental or a deathbed repentance or a hundred prayers offered punctiliously according to prescribed ecclesiastical law or any number of fasts and penances calculated to atone for the sin of the past or to license the communicant for future sin."

"We believe in hell as a supreme manifestation of God's love, calculated to cleanse and purify the soul and bring the sinner out of sin into righteousness."

"But, my friends, it takes more than a belief in this or that doctrine to make a Universalist. It requires a vision of duty, a spirit of consecration to the great tasks of life, active service in an advancing world."

"We must not only believe in God's universal fatherhood, but we must seek God through the service of our fellow men."

"We must not only recognize Christ's leadership, but we must follow where He leads in the world's life today. We must not only believe in the Bible, but must govern our lives by its great and noble precepts. We must not only believe in the hell of life experience as a manifestation of divine love, but must exert ourselves continually to overcome those influences that drag us down and exclude from our souls the joys of heaven. We must believe in our power and our responsibility as children of God, and know that the call of God is a call to active life."

"The gospel of Universalism, which is our interpretation of the Christ gospel, is an intensely practical gospel. Our gospel is a gospel of faith and hope and love. But, above all, it is a gospel of work," the Rev. Mr. Line stated.

DR. WICKS LAUDS BIBLE

"Knowledge of Book Essential to Educated Person," Says Pastor.

"Not to know the Bible is to miss much that is significant in our culture," declared Dr. Frank S. C. Wicks at All Souls Unitarian Church Sunday.

H. C. Huffstetter, finance chairman, paid tribute to the work of Dr. Wicks, who began his pastorate twenty years ago.

LEAGUE MEETS TO PLAN PEACE

Greek-Bulgar, British-Turkish Disputes Up.

GENEVA, Dec. 7.—The Council of the League of Nations met here today for what is expected to be the most important meeting in its history.

Friends of the League see as the probable result of the meeting its final rise to a secure position of worldwide power and respect. At the session the Council is to make formal arrangements for the admission of Germany, final decisions on the dangerous Greco-Bulgarian situation and the British-Turkish dispute over Mosul, and to plan far-

reaching European disarmament and peace conferences based on the foundation laid by the Locarno pact.

The session was presided over by Senator Scialoja, the Italian delegate and personal representative of Mussolini.

ASK \$6,500,000 FOR OHIO RIVER

Improvements Costing \$55,-
062,065 Requested.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—Appropriation of \$55,062,065 for river and

harbor improvement for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1927, compared with \$52,121,955 expended last year, was recommended by Maj. Gen. H. Taylor, chief of Army engineers, in his annual report made public today.

Greater New York harbor headed the list with proposed allotments exceeding \$8,000,000, besides \$1,400,000 for Hudson River improvements.

Other major recommendations included: Construction Ohio River locks and dams, \$6,500,000.
