

NEW NAME FOR SCHOOL ASKED

Board Asked to Pay Tribute to World War Hero.

The Indianapolis school board Monday night was asked to name School 9, the Sgt. Otis E. Brown school, in tribute to Brown, who was killed in the World War. The request, made by Harry B. Dynes, former selective board chairman, was referred to Superintendent E. U. Graff. Charles Reissner, secretary, was granted a leave of absence until Jan. 1, because of ill health. The board refused the Roxana Petroleum Company an advertisement on the north wall of Manual Training High School. The building and grounds committee will select a site for a new school between Schools 70 and 71.

William H. Book, business director, was authorized to advertise for bids on wrecking the buildings of School 42, recently burned.

The board will meet at 5 p.m. Dec. 18, to receive bids on several minor improvements. Need for new buildings to house branch libraries was set out in a report of the finance committee with the recommendation that this program be followed next year.

BUS LINE LOSES IN BEECH GROVE

Court Sustains Demurrer of Town Board.

Beech Grove town board members were jubilant today over their victory Tuesday afternoon when Judge T. J. Moll of Superior Court Five ruled against the South Side Motor Coach Company. Judge Moll sustained a demurrer filed by the board to the bus firm's petition for an injunction to prevent the enforcement of an ordinance, prohibiting busses from receiving or discharging passengers on streets used by the Beech Grove Traction Company.

Willard T. Tice, board president, said ample time would be given bus officials to change their route. Gilbert McFarland, of the bus company, said the company would not change the route.

He was convicted in the Porter County court Tuesday, after refusing to enter a plea of guilty to manslaughter as suggested by the State attorney.




