

POPULAR ROAD NEAR BEDFORD IS OPEN AGAIN

Traffic Can Cross White
River Bottom, State Bulle-
tin Announces.

Work on the new bridge and State road, south of Bedford has progressed to a point that traffic by Saturday may again cross White River on the old bridge and follow the old State road through the river bottoms, the State highway commission's weekly traffic bulletin announced today. This construction occupied the greater part of this season during which traffic detoured. Use of the old road again is a great convenience to that section, as 22 is one of the most traveled roads of the State system.

Pavement will be completed Saturday on the bridge near Traders Point, twelve miles northwest of Indianapolis on No. 6, and it is hoped to open this structure and remove the short but bad detour, about the first of January.

More Detours Lifted

Run-arounds and detours have been lifted in the last few days near Dupont and Wirt on No. 26; near Crawfordsville and Noblesville on No. 33, and at 3.3 miles east of Blocher and 1.7 miles west of Kent on No. 40. The bulletin pointed out that the road is new near Blocher and as the shoulders are unsettled, it might be advisable to use the old detour in case of heavy rains.

Surface conditions on roads entering Indianapolis are set forth in the bulletin as follows:

No. 1 (New Albany, Indianapolis, South Bend, Michigan line)—Detour just north of Peru, account of dredge ditch. Detour from two miles north of Ellettsburg to Franklin, account of paving, is rough. Account remaining Marshall bridge detour to east over Rd. 40 through Scottsburg, returning to No. 1 at Austin.

No. 3 (Richmond, Indianapolis, Terre Haute)—Temporary bridge at six miles west of Richmond; run-around at one-eighth mile east of Pershing.

Bridge Paving.
No. 6 (Madison, Greensburg, Indianapolis, Lafayette, Oxford)—Closed until about Jan. 1 to pave over bridge at Traders Point, twelve miles west of Indianapolis; detour marked. Detour at two miles north of Lebanon to Thornton Rd., thence north through Thornton to No. 6. Side detour one and one-half miles northwest of Thornton, and short detour one mile farther northwest.

No. 12 (Vincennes, Spencer, Indianapolis)—Drive carefully at approaches to lem-

called by Old Friend.

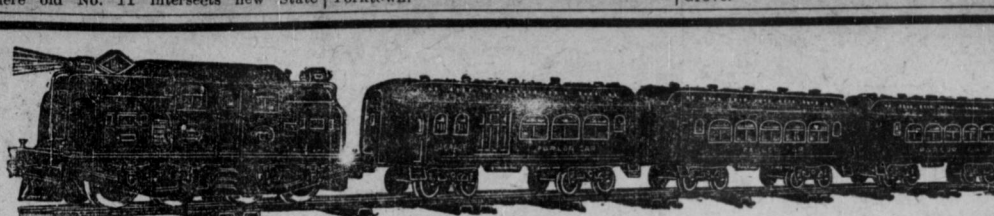

No. 22 (English, Paoli, Bedford, Bloomington, Martinsville, Indianapolis)—Closed at a point five miles south of Indianapolis for constructing overhead railroad bridge. Detour is out S. Meridian St. and Three Notch Rd., thence over one mile of gravel road to No. 22. Closed between Martinsville and Bloomington use Nos. 12 and 22. Beginning Saturday, Dec. 12, traffic use old bridge and old road around bridge and road construction two miles south of Bedford. At Paoli take a county road to Grantsburg via Marengo and English. Avoid south of Grantsburg account of construction and no detour roads.
Using new pavement from Indianapolis to Muncie. (If workingmen are building shoulders near McCordville, then detour will be marked.) Detour around bridge

construction at Ingalls. Use old No. 11 at junction of 11 and 37 from two and one-half miles south of Pendleton to where old No. 11 intersects new State road. Drive this route carefully, as shoulder work is still in progress all along route. Bridge run-around at north edge of Yorktown.



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
