## MARKET SELLS MOUNTED TREES

Holly and Wreaths Also Are  
on Stands.

Mounted Christmas trees, shipped in from Maine, were priced at \$1 and up, today at the city market. The supply is plentiful and no shortage is anticipated, but the better shaped trees are selling rapidly. Holly wreaths sold at 10 and 40 cents each. Loose holly was priced from 20 to 50 cents a bunch.

Cranberries dropped 5 cents to a price of 20 cents a pound. Eggs were unchanged and sold at 65 cents a dozen.

Other prices included: alligator pears, 80 cents each; Florida oranges, 50 cents a dozen; California oranges, 60 cents a dozen; peaches, 25 cent a pound; grapefruit, 10 and 15 cents each; pineapples, 40 and 80 cents each; Florida tomatoes, 35 cents a pound; and hot house tomatoes, 40 cents a pound.

Butter sold at 65 cents a pound; chickens were 40 and 45 cents a pound; turkeys, 60 and 65 cents a pound; ducks, 40 cents a pound; green and wax beans, 20 cents a pound and cabbage 6 cents a pound.


