

## 'ESPIONAGE' IS OPPOSED IN U. S.

Johnson Would Not Import  
Any From Europe.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 16.—Hiram Johnson of California, chairman of the Senate Immigration Committee, will oppose any attempt in this Congress to pass legislation requiring registration of aliens.

"I have not seen any specific bills on this subject and don't know in what form it will come before us," says Johnson, "but as a general proposition I am against police registration. I do not want to import the police espionage of Europe into this country."

In this stand Senator Johnson will be supported by Representative Johnson of Washington, chairman of the House Immigration Committee.

Representative Johnson has repeatedly declared himself for registration and says he believes it will promote naturalization and Americanization.
