CONSTANTINOPLE, Dec. 18.—An Asiatic League of Nations is advocated by the Turkish press today in the course of vituperative articles against the present League of Nations.

Sensational condemnation of the Mosul decision is voiced, the papers adding that Turkey is unwilling to enter the present organization.

The council of ministers so far has failed to reach any decision as to Turkey's course toward the award of Mosul to Iraq, over which Britain will exercise an extended mandate.


