TOO MANY LAWS DISGUST MOSES

Senator Believes Nation Is Being Strangled.

CHICAGO, Dec. 18.—The United States is being strangled by the multiplicity of laws, Senator George H. Moses of New Hampshire believes. In a speech here last night to the Cook County Real Estate Board, Moses declared that 59,000 new statutes were enacted by the forty-eighth Congress and the State legislatures in two years.

"The Sixty-Ninth Congress apparently is out to shatter the present amenable record for law-making," Moses said. "When I left Washington yesterday, Congress, only nine days old, had 10,000 new pieces of legislation introduced."

Moses declared his opposition to American membership in the world court with the words:

"And not content with meddling with the private affairs of our millions, we now wish to launch into meddlesomeness abroad to become entangled in the turmoil and hatreds of the old world."

TOWN MARSHAL SUED

Made Defendant in Complaint Charging Assault and Battery.

Obe Craig, Beech Grove town marshal, was named defendant to day in a complaint charging assault and battery filed by Richard Baker, 15, of Beech Grove, in the justice of the peace court of Henry Hurst. Baker charged Craig beat him.
