## CHURCH, PEACE ARE DISCUSSED

General Everson Speaks at  
Big Meeting.

"Armed men restrain the world, but it can be saved only by the church of God," declared Brig. Gen. William G. Everson of Muncie, ranking minister in the United States reserve army, at the Y. M. C. A. Big Meeting Sunday afternoon at English's Theater.

Such projects as disarmament and reorganization of the air service will fade into oblivion when the national powers gather to eliminate international misunderstanding, General Everson predicted.

"Whatever will be the outcome of diplomatic controversy and world politics, America, if she awakens her responsibility and uses her influence, will hold the balance of power in establishing friendly understanding," he said. Many women attended the meeting.

Governor Jackson will speak at the next meeting, Jan. 10. During January the meetings will be open to women.

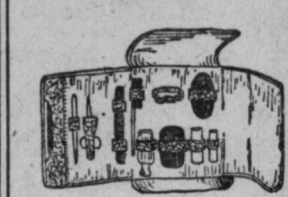

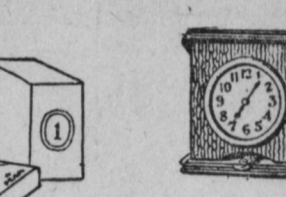
