

STRIKE PEACE MOVE SET BACK

Settlement Parley Likely
After Holidays.

SCRANTON, Pa., Dec. 22.—The latest attempt to bring together anthracite operators and miners for negotiations which would end the hard coal strike, has received a setback which probably will keep it in abeyance until after Christmas.

After an exchange of telegrams Mayor John F. Durkin, chairman of the committee of mayors in the anthracite region, announced that a meeting set for this afternoon, would not be held.

Despite this sudden hitch in the negotiations, executives feel that the miners and operators are closer to an end of the suspension than at any time since September and that a renewal of peace efforts after the holidays is reasonably certain of success.
