

SCHOOL MONEY IS APPORTIONED

City Will Get \$255,046 From State.

Indianapolis will receive \$255,046 as its share of the \$2,658,471 raised last year by the 7-cent State school levy, which was being apportioned today by George A. Spencer, assistant State superintendent of public instruction.

On a \$3.21 per capita allowance for the 89,238 pupils in Marion County, its share will be \$386,937. Most of this amount is absorbed by Indianapolis, since 79,307 of the county's pupils are in the city. The total distribution represents

70 per cent of the amount raised by the seven-cent levy, the other 30 per cent being distributed on the basis of each county's relative need for funds. Checks will be sent out Saturday.

BIG DAY FOR LOUIS THOMAS

All Kinds of Court Action Faced Saturday.

Louis Thomas, 444 W. Washington St., restaurant proprietor, who faces two jail terms and possibly a third, will appear in Criminal Court Saturday.

Over a week ago Judge James A. Collins fined Thomas \$250 and costs on the Indiana State Farm on charge of possession of liquor. Next day Thomas was fined \$500 and costs and sentenced ninety days on the farm by Judge Clinton H. Givan of Superior Court Four on a contempt of court charge.

Thomas was charged with violating an order by Judge Givan restraining him from selling liquor at his restaurant. Thomas appealed both rulings, but later decided he would dismiss his appeals Saturday. Thomas is at liberty on appeal bonds.

Thomas also will be tried Saturday in Criminal Court on a charge of violating the liquor law made by Federal agents and local officers who raided his place. Nistor Potocova, an employee, will be tried on a similar charge.
