

LEGION TAKES CONCERT BOX

Officials to Show Appreciation to Paderewski.

American Legion national headquarters has taken a box for the concert of Ignace Jan Paderewski, world famous pianist and Polish World War hero, who will appear in a concert at the Murat Theater Sunday afternoon at 3, it was announced today by National Adjutant James F. Barton.

This was done in appreciation of the great artist's recent efforts for the Legion's endowment fund for disabled veterans and orphans of the World War and in honor of his distinguished World War record generally, said Barton.

It is expected that national Legion officers will occupy the box. Paderewski's gift recently of \$28,487.67 was the largest individual gift received for the Legion's endowment fund and represented the entire proceeds from benefit concerts at New York, Philadelphia, Washington and Boston. Paderewski paid all expenses for the concerts.

North Side Home of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Horuff Has Many Fine Interior Decorative Features



One of the finest Indianapolis homes finished in recent months is that of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Horuff, 5130 N. Meridian St., which was built for them by H. L. Simons and which contains numberless building and interior decorative features of rare distinction.

The house has the advantage of being well placed in a lot 150 by 300 feet, and is reached by a winding, multi-colored flagstone walk. The exterior, of buff brick, with stone trim and half-timber interstices, is quietly elegant.

Entering the marble-floored hall, a blend of colorful beauty arrests the eye. The living room and sun parlor are to the left, the handsome dining room to the west of the hall, and the striking poly-chrome wrought-iron railing, marks the rich dark winding of the stair, to the right.

Marble, Stone Fireplace

The living room, with a marble and stone fireplace at one end, has an immense, central rug—a Royal Kashan, one of the finest in the country. It strikes a lovely note of rose, repeated in a smaller Royal Saruk and in the broadest velvet drapes of the windows, which are held in place by gold cornices. Flanking the fireplace are built-in bookcases.

The sun room is a delight of broad casement windows, with hand-blocked chintz curtains, gay and colorful; French doors looking to a fine view to the west, and rock maple furniture. The walls here, as in the living room and hall, are in mottled tones of buff, cream and sand color.

Breakfast Room Gay

The rich, somber brown of the carved, Italian dining room furniture is contrasted in the clear Tiffany blue of the walls, in satin brocade drapes at the casement windows and in the blue Royal Saruk rug. Old gold cornices of grapes hold the tint of the handsome center light and side wall fixtures. A breakfast room adjoining is gay with satin-striped pale apricot drapes, silver lighting fixtures and an adorable breakfast set with hand painted bouquets.

A green and ivory enamel kitchen, has built-in features galore, inclinator, four-drawer Frigidaire and every convenience known to the modern builder. A maid's room, with bath is to the west of the kitchen and another bath downstairs, is to the left of a marble-floored portico, directly in line with a four-car garage.

Three Baths

Upstairs, there are four bedrooms and three baths. Striking features of the master bedroom are bay, casement windows and French doors leading to an upstairs porch. Small oriental rugs in all the upstairs rooms are laid across floors of rich, dark finish. The guestroom, especially beautiful in furnishings of rose, has a bathroom which could be a model in any exhibition. Another striking bathroom is in black and white marble and leads off the master bedroom.

In the basement, besides an unusually equipped laundry and many closets, is a social room, with fireplace and a waxed dancing floor.
