Asked to Aid City.**

Proposal of a city flower garden
at Northwestern Ave. and Fall Creek
Bvd. was investigated today by a
park board committee, of which R.
Walter Jarvis, superintendent, and

H. Houston Tall, assistant, are mem-
bers.

Following approval of Mayor Du-
val, at a board meeting Thursday,
it was decided to ask florists and
seed dealers to contribute bulbs and
plants.

The board ordered work started
on a boulevard on east side of White
River between Thirtieth and Thirty
Third Sts., appointed appraisers for
Pleasant Run Pkwy., between Eng-
lish Ave. and Denny St., and appro-
priated \$7,500 to remodel a house
on the Sarah Shank golf course.

Boulevard lights were ordered for
Brookside Pkwy., south drive; be-

tween Jefferson Ave. and Sherman
Dr., Pleasant Run Pkwy., south
drive, from Emerson Ave. to James-
son Park, and from Ritter Ave. to
the bridge across Pleasant Run; Pleasant
Run Pkwy., north drive, from Emerson
Ave. to Jameson Park.


