

## EX-MINISTER OF U. S. DIES

John C. Wright Was Son of  
Indiana Governor.

John C. Wright, 93, former United States minister to Indianapolis and a resident of Indianapolis seventy-five years, died Sunday morning at his home at the Blanche Apts., after a year's illness. Because of sickness in the family

of a granddaughter, Mrs. George N. Owen of Great Neck, L. I., funeral services will be delayed at least two weeks. The body will lie at the Flanner & Euchanan funeral parlor for the time.

Up to a year ago Wright was actively engaged in the real estate business here. Following his return from Prussia, he entered the wholesale grocery business and later became interested in banking.

He was born in Parke County, Oct. 17, 1832, the son of Joseph A. Wright, Governor of Indiana from 1849 to 1856. Wright succeeded his father to the ministerial post in Prussia in 1867. Besides the granddaughter, four

great-grandchildren and Joseph Albert Wright of Sparta, Ore., a half-brother, survive. Mrs. Wright died in 1922. Wright was a member of the Columbia and University Clubs.

Robinson Is Law Observance  
Sunday Speaker.

A vigorous defense of prohibition was made Sunday by Senator Arthur R. Robinson in an address at Cadle Tabernacle before 1,800 persons climaxing law observance Sunday sponsored by the Indiana Anti-Saloon League. Other prominent

speakers included Dr. Howard H. Russell, Westerville, Ohio, who repeated today at the Indianapolis Ministerial Association meeting his statement that every effort possible is being made by wets to break down the eighteenth amendment.

Robinson said: "The saloons have gone for good. No longer does the hell hole of a saloon grab our boys and make of them drunken sots. Any one who doesn't obey the law is a rebel against our Government."


