Bar Members Laud Attorney—Rites at Church.

Two services were held today in memory of Aquilla Q. Jones, 72, attorney, who died Sunday at his home, 3283 Fall Creek Blvd. At 11 a. m. tribute was paid Mr. Jones by the Indianapolis Bar Association in Circuit Court.

James M. Ogden, president, presided. Charles E. Cox, former Indiana Supreme Court judge, presented a resolution on the death of Mr. Jones. Other members of the committee named by Ralph Bamberger, chairman memorials committee, were: Judge E. A. Dausman, Appellate Court; Judge James A. Collins, Criminal Court; John W. Holtzman, Martin M. Hugg, Henry Spaan, Lew Wallace, J. Clyde Hoffman and William W. Hammond. Committee members spoke.

Funeral services were held at 2 p. m. at the Church of the Advent, of which Mr. Jones was a member. The Rev. Clarence W. Bispham, rector, and Bishop Joseph M. Francis of the Indianapolis diocese, officiated.

Burial was in Crown Hill cemetery.

He is survived by the widow and two sons, Melvin and Kenneth, all of Indianapolis; his mother, Mrs. Ella J. Freeman, and four brothers and two sisters at Long Beach, Cal.
