

## PACIFIC COAST CITIES FACING RULE BY WOMEN

Seattle and Tacoma Go to Primary With Feminine Candidates in Race.

SEATTLE, Wash., Feb. 23.—Seattle is facing the oddest political situation of its history.

The voters will nominate two candidates for mayor at the primary election today. It is generally conceded that Mrs. Bertha Landes, present member of the city council and wife of Dean Henry Landes of the University of Washington, will be one of the two chosen.

Mrs. Landes made a vigorous campaign for the office and at the same time an equally vigorous campaign to abolish office of mayor in behalf of the city manager plan of government.

Mrs. Landes gained prominence two years ago while acting mayor of Seattle during the absence of Mayor Edwin J. Brown, who was in New York attending the Democratic national convention.

Declaring the city to be vivacious and charging that the police are merely winking at conditions, she ousted the police chief, named an inspector as chief, fired the latter when he refused to carry out her orders for a clean-up, and then called in a captain from the precinct who had been banished by the administration. Mayor Brown quit the national convention and returned home to discharge the new police chief and reinstate the old one. Mayor Brown is one of four men who oppose Mrs. Landes.

Takes Mitchell to Task in Talk Before Military Order.
