

## EXAMINER FOR STATE BOARD DEFIES CRITICS

Orr, in Address, Says He Intends to Follow Law's Provisions.

Persons criticizing the State board of accounts were defied by Lawrence F. Orr, State examiner, in an address at the Irvington Republican Club Monday night.

Odd faced considerable criticism because the board investigated the State highway commission. The board report afterward was impounded but highway commission members were indicted by the Marion County grand jury.

"I intend to follow the provisions of the law and do my duty as there is provided, let the chips fall where they will," Orr said. "You can put it down as an established fact that when a fellow cries that politics is influencing any of our examinations that fellow has endeavored by politics to obstruct and hinder a proper investigation and has not succeeded in doing so."

Orr said he had never allowed politics to enter into his examinations.

"It is gratifying, however, to note that most public officials desire to cooperate with our department," he stated.
