**CANDIDATES IN
PRECINCT RACE
START BATTLE**

Positions as Committeemen
Sought After New
Boundaries Fixed.

A scramble of candidates for positions of precinct committeemen was on today, following announcement of new Marion County precinct boundaries by county commissioners. There are now 269 precincts in the county, an increase of sixty-four.

Commissioners said many of the precincts were created to relieve congestion at the polls. Heretofore many persons in large precincts have been unable to vote because of the large numbers waiting in line when the polls are about to close. Commissioner Cassius L. Hogle said in some precincts there were as many as 1,900 voters.

Provided for by Act

Redistricting was provided for by an act of the 1925 Legislature. New law provides that all precincts must lie entirely within the corporate limits or entirely outside the city.

The increase it is said will aid George V. Coffin, Republican county chairman who is seeking re-election. The Marion County Voters' League opposing Coffin, is preparing to put up candidates in each precinct for precinct committeemen. The committeemen elect the county chairman at a reorganization meeting, the Saturday following the primary. The primary is May 4 this year.

On the Democratic side there has not been much interest displayed over the precinct organization. It is reported party factional leaders have come to an agreement whereby precinct committeemen will be placed in the field and elected on the basis of merit and party loyalty.

Increases

The sixteen precincts in the First ward have been increased to twenty. Nine precincts have been added to the twenty-one already in the Fourth ward. In the Ninth ward the number of precincts was increased from sixteen to twenty-one, and in the Tenth ward from thirteen to twenty-two.

In the Thirteenth ward increase of five precincts was made, making the new number fifteen. In Warren Township the number was increased from five to nine, and in Washington Township an addition of ten precincts was made, giving the township twenty-two precincts.

**BREWERY READY
TO MAKE BEER**

Anheuser-Busch Believes
Time Is at Hand.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., March 31. — The Anheuser-Busch Company, one of the largest brewing companies in the world, is ready to make real beer on an instant's notice, officials of the company said today.

Believing the trend of public opinion is definitely away from prohibition, equipment and machinery of the breweries here is so organized that only a slight change would be necessary to make pre-war beer, George A. H. Mills, secretary, said.

Recently the Anheuser-Busch Company and the Pabst breweries of Milwaukee were granted permits by the Federal Government to make a malt liquor of 3.75 per cent alcoholic content by volume. Manufacture of the malt liquor will begin within a week, Mills said.

**TTUITION BOOST
REASON GIVEN**

Gifts Reduced, Says Presi-
dent of De Pauw.

GREENCASTLE, Ind., March 31. — Explanation of the increase in De Pauw tuition fees from \$69 to \$12.50 a semester was given today by President Murlin. He gave a number of reasons:

The Rockefeller board has withdrawn its annual \$15,000 gift.

The Methodist Centenary fund has been decreased from \$26,000 to \$14,500 a year.

Cost of supplies, printing, coal, lights, and service have increased.

The faculty has been overcrowded with work, and reinforcement of the teaching staff is necessary.

The student body has increased, making a heavier demand on the budget as De Pauw pays from one-half to two-thirds of the actual cost of the students' training.

New equipment is needed, such as libraries, laboratories and recitation halls.
