

# **RULES GIVEN FOR RUBBISH COLLECTIONS**

City Will Cooperate in Two Weeks' Clean-Up Campaign.

Rules for collection of rubbish during the two weeks clean-up and paint-up campaign sponsored by the Junior Chamber of Commerce, which opens Monday, were announced today by Truly Nolan, superintendent of the city sanitary district. They are:

Collectors will take rubbish, except straw, paper, tree limbs and manure. Material must be placed in alley, or in front curb where there is no alley, not later than 7 a. m. on collection days. Collectors will not enter yards. It is a dischargeable offense for a collector to accept tips.

All stove and furnace pipes must be flattened out, tin gutters and spoutings must be not longer than six feet. Rubbish must be in containers that can be loaded by one man. Collectors do not load anything with shovels.

Collectors are not permitted to wait on anyone. Collectors are not permitted to take plastering, cement, brick or any other building material. For information as to collection days or complaints telephone city collection department at Belmont 2144.

Collection districts for rubbish and ashes during the campaign are given below. Collections will be made on these days both weeks.

Monday—North of Thirty-Second St. to Fifty-Second St., between Crown Hill and Fall Creek. Also the district of North of Thirty-Second St. to the city limits on the north and east and on the south by Nowland Ave., west of Rural St. and Michigan St., east of Rural St. to the Belt Railroad.

Tuesday—Twenty-First to Thirty-Second, between Indianapolis and Belt Railroad; Irvington including all territory east of the Belt Railroad; also district between Rural St. and Belt Railroad, south of Michigan St. to city limits.

Wednesday—Territory between Tenth and Twenty-First St., from the Canal to the L. E. & W. R. R. tracks. Also from the Monon Railroad to Rural St., between the Pennsylvania Railroad tracks and the L. E. & W. Railroad tracks.

Thursday—Territory from Tenth St. south to Louisa St. Also district between Pennsylvania Railroad tracks and Prospect St. from Madison Ave. to Rural St. Prospect St. from Madison Ave. to Rural St. Prospect St. and south of Prospect St. to the city limits. Also all territory north of Michigan St. and west of White River. Also territory bounded on the east by Washington St. and on the north by Crown Hill.

Saturday—All territory west of White River and south of Michigan St. to the city limits. Also all territory east of White River to Madison Ave., from South St. south to the city limits. All territory north of Fifty-Second St., including Broad Ripple is collected on Saturday also.

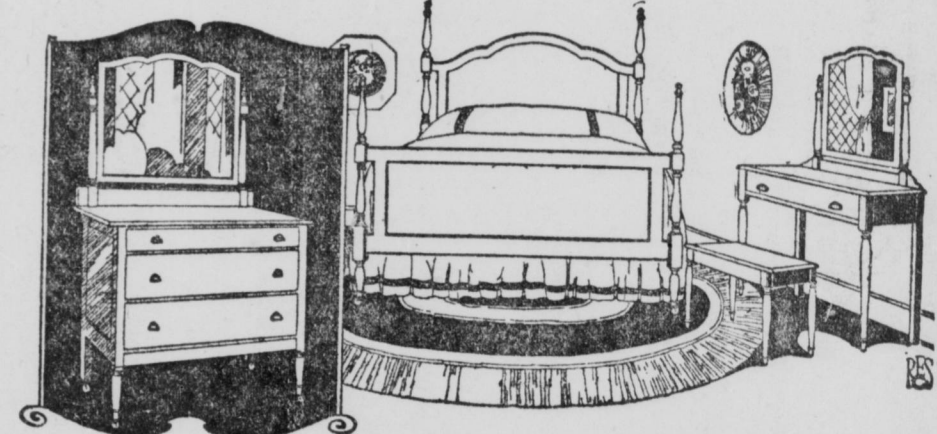

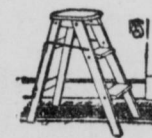
