

## SIX CANDIDATES HEARD AT I. U.

Senatorial Aspirants Speak  
at Democratic Rally.

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., April 22.—Six candidates for the Democratic long term senatorial nomination spoke Wednesday night at a rally of Monroe County Democrats and Indiana University students here.

With the exception of William Curry of Indianapolis, who came out for modification of the Volstead law, the prohibition issue was not mentioned. Other speakers discussed farm relief, tariff and economic questions.

It was the first time during the campaign that all of the candidates have spoken at the same gathering.

The candidates were: William A. Cullop, Vincennes; John Frederick, Kokomo; George Rauch, Marion; Albert Stump, L. Ert Slack and William Curry, all of Indianapolis.

Evans Woollen, Indianapolis, was the only candidate not present. Dean Paul V. McNutt of the Indiana Law School, represented him.

### RYAN AT GREENCASTLE

Urges Cooperation With Nations  
Without Entanglement.

## ADAMS TO TALK AT SOUTH BEND

Senatorial Candidate Will

SOUTH BEND, Ind., April 22.—Claris Adams, candidate for the Republican long-term senatorial nomination, arrived in South Bend today and will address a mass meeting of northern Indiana Republicans at the high school tonight.

### TO GO TO EXPOSITION

Indiana Will Send Boy, Girl and  
Teacher to Philadelphia.

Plans were completed today by a special committee headed by Dr. Henry Noble Sherwood, State superintendent of public instruction, for paying expenses of one high school boy, one girl and one teacher from Indiana to the Philadelphia Sesquicentennial Exposition, June 1 to Dec. 1.

The boy and girl, each of which must not be over 13 years old, will be chosen at a convention of applicants June 12 at the Statehouse. The teacher will be chosen June 14. May 10 is the last date for entering the contest. The school children will be chosen for some special act of heroism or other qualification, and the teacher for her value to education. Application blanks may be obtained from Dr. Sherwood.

### OLD BOARD TO MEET

Regular Members Will Attend—Secretary of Wrangle Later.

With the determination of the park board wrangle safely postponed until after the primary election, old board members will meet in regular session today. Of the number, Emsley W. Johnson, president, is discharged, according to Mayor Duval's viewpoint. Frank P. Manly and Albert M. Maguire, board members, will be asked to resign, Duval said.



## PARKING SPACE IN LAWN, PLAN

Council to Order Market  
Stands Removed.

Conversion of the north part of the courthouse yard into a parking place and removal of fruit and vegetable stands from the sidewalks about the city market were deemed likely today following a campaign of the board of safety and county commissioners.

George G. Schmidt, city engineer, is preparing estimates for covering the courthouse lawn with gravel, and city councilmen plan a special session to adopt the ordinance clearing the market sidewalks. Removal of boxes and barrels from the sidewalks along "commission row" on S. Delaware St., will be included.

The special session also will consider an increase in wholesale junk dealers' licenses from \$150 to \$1,000 a year.

## RESCINDING OF ORDER PROPOSED

Orr Points to U. S. Court Ac-  
tion in Barret Law.

Lawrence F. Orr, chief State examiner, in an explanation of the system whereby Marion County treasurers keep the interest on the Indianapolis Barrett law fund, today suggested that Corporation Counsel Alvah J. Rucker take steps to have a 1908 Federal Court order vacated to stop the practice.

Rucker is investigating the system. The court order restrains treasurers from depositing the fund in a public depository, thereby defeating the law's intent, Orr pointed out, by making the fund inaccessible for the city controller to invest in interest-bearing securities, the return from which was intended by law to offset the fund deficit.
