

DENTAL HEALTH WEEK ACCORDED OFFICIAL PRAISE

Talks to Be Given Before Luncheon Clubs of City and State.

Dr. John H. Green, president of the State board of health, and Sol Schloss, city board of health president, have highly commended the educational and oral hygiene committee of the Indiana State Dental Association for the effort it is making during Dental Health week to acquaint the public with simple facts that will lead to better dental health conditions.

In a letter to Dr. Mary H. Westfall, State chairman of the committee, Dr. Green said: "It is a well established fact that many of the most serious ills of adult life are due to bad teeth and that most dental troubles start with the neglect of the teeth during childhood. Any movement such as Dental Health week that will aid in teaching parents the necessity of proper dental hygiene for their children should have the most hearty cooperation from all."

Necessity for Care
Schloss said: "Too much publicity cannot be given in regard to the early care of the teeth. My short experience with the city board of health has convinced me of the necessity for proper care of the teeth, especially among the younger generation."

The week's activities will include a number of talks before luncheon clubs of the city and State. Today

at noon, Dr. Frederick R. Henshaw, dean of Indiana University School of Dentistry will address the Rotary Club, at the Claypool; Dr. Mary Westfall, the Gyro Club, at the Lincoln, and Dr. George King, the Mercator Club, Spink-Arms.


