Candidate Says He Would Make No Lectures From Bench.

The judiciary received a slight indirect "razzing" in a statement today by Frank N. Fitzgerald, 1318 Laurel St., candidate for the Republican nomination for judge of Superior Court One.

"I think \$7,500 a year is too much salary for that office," his statement read. "I have no patience with judges who try to conform opinions to public opinion or sentiment. Courts should be run on a basis of strict legal practice without lectures or speeches from the bench and without outbursts of judicial wrath."

"I shall not issue political injunctions and shall be very, very stingy on most any injunction. I shall know no color, creed or race and no fear of wealth or influence. I don't want to get rich. I have no need of a large amount of money."
