

THEFT CASE TO FEDERAL JURY

Woman, Son Charged With
Robbing Mails.

Mrs. D. F. Shroyer, Richmond, was placed under \$500 bond and her son, Charles O. Douglas, 23, employed at the postal sub-station, Illinois and South Sts., was placed under \$2,500 bond and bound over to the Federal grand jury Wednesday afternoon on charges of mail theft.

It is charged Douglas stole a letter from the mails containing two railroad tickets valued at \$95. It is said he mailed them to his mother and she secured a refund from the railroad.

Mrs. Shroyer was released on her own recognizance. Douglas was sent to jail in default of bond.

THIRD NEGRO IS GIVEN 20 YEARS

Rapid Justice Meted Out to
Trio—Two to Hang.

MADISONVILLE, Ky., April 29.—Bunyan Fleming and Nathan Bard are condemned to hang. Columbus Hollis must spend twenty years in prison.

It took three juries just three days to arrive at the verdicts in the Circuit Court here in the cases of the three Negroes charged with criminally attacking Miss Nell Breithaupt, a white girl, near here on the night of April 7.

Hollis, convicted today, escaped the extreme penalty because his confession brought about the arrest of the other two. Hollis said he did not take part in the actual attack.

ROAD BONDS APPROVED

Improvement of Last Link of Kessler Blvd. Assured.

Construction of the last unimproved link of Kessler Blvd., was assured today when State tax commissioners approved a \$47,000 bond issue for paving the Elmer Dawson Road, as the boulevard is known, between Bellefontaine St. and Keystone Ave. Action on a remonstrance has been pending since last fall, when objections were heard to a \$51,500 issue. The tax board directed county commissioners to receive bids, recently, the lowest, being \$45,000.

Washington Township will bear the expense, although the project is sponsored by the park board. John J. Brown, chairman of the tax board, did not participate in today's action.

DEPUTIES TO SAVE GIRL

Child Held in Mountains as Hostage
for \$600 Debt.

CHARLESTON, W. Va., April 29.—Armed deputies today prepared to penetrate the mountain fastnesses of Summers County to take by force, if necessary, a 12-year-old girl whose mother, Mrs. Mary Norville Burrell, asserts she is being held as hostage for a \$600 debt.

The little girl, Edna Smith Burrell, has been living with her mountaineer guardian—a mother and four sons—in a rustic mountain cabin for three years, and it was not until her mother sought to recover her that she discovered the child was being held in virtual captivity.
