

HAMRICK FILES EVIDENCE WITH PARDON BOARD

Attorney Denies Charges of 'Bleeding' Prisoner In Freedom Move.

Certified copies of contracts and other evidence tending to show that Jesse D. Hamrick, Indianapolis attorney, had not "bled" Mrs. Sarah Della Reese of Murphysboro, Ill., for defending her son, John L. Reese, now serving a ten to twenty-one-year sentence in the Indiana State Reformatory, were filed with the State pardon board today by Hamrick.

Mrs. Reese, through her attorney, George Hoffman, Monday charged Hamrick with extorting approximately \$1,600 from her by "pretending" to defend her son while actually plotting to block his efforts to obtain freedom, and by asserting that he could "buy members of the pardon board and fix things up with the superintendent of the Reformatory."

Contract Produced

Hamrick this morning filed a copy of his contract with Mrs. Reese, in which, for a \$600 fee, he agreed to press the boy's plea for clemency. He also filed copies of letters exchanged between himself and Mrs. Reese showing she had insisted on an immediate petition for her son's release, whereas Hamrick had opposed hasty action, making it plain to her that great uncertainty attended the boy's future action on the case. Other papers showed that one of the group pressing charges against Hamrick is in arrears in the payment of a legal fee.

Acquaintance Denied

Hamrick, accompanied by his wife, appeared Monday afternoon before the pardon board and made a word

for word denial of each of the charges. He denied he had been served with a subpoena from the board and was cleared of any blame for not having appeared when the charges were read. He also disclaimed acquaintance with any members of the present board.

Both Hamrick and his wife are under indictment for conspiracy to commit arson, in connection with the recent burning of their palatial residence on the Michigan Rd. Trial has been tentatively set for June 14 before Special Judge James M. Leathers.

Mrs. William Decker, 2 1/2 Massachusetts Ave., aunt of John Reese by marriage, was to appear before the board and deny charges of conspiracy which Mrs. Reese made. She said she would deny dividing with Hamrick fees which he received for defending the youth. This was charged by Mrs. Reese. Mrs. Decker said she did not receive a subpoena to appear before the board Monday.

NO ONE BLAMED FOR BOY'S DEATH

Lad Killed When Struck by Concrete Mixer Shovel.

Coroner Paul F. Robinson and Sergt. Frank Stevens of the police accident prevention bureau today said preliminary investigation showed that no one was to blame for a fatal accident late Monday at Michigan St. and Arsenal Ave., when a large concrete mixer shovel crushed and killed Robert Wallace, 5, of 1206 E. Vermont St.

Witnesses said the boy was playing on the side of the machine opposite operator, Sam Young,

1716 N. Arsenal Ave. As the shovel was raised he went underneath and his head was crushed when the heavy piece of machinery came down. Christian Reis, 410 N. Arsenal Ave., shouted to Young, but the boy already had been struck. He died in a few minutes.

Mrs. Gordon Wallace, the boy's mother, rushed to the scene in a hysterical condition. She had not known that the lad was away from home.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday at the residence, with burial at Franklin. The boy is survived by the parents a twin sister, Betty, and another sister.
