

GERMAN VICTORY ARCH UNDERGOES NEEDED REPAIRS

Brandenburg Gate Scene of
Rejoicing and Sorrow

BERLIN, June 4.—The Brandenburg gate, one of Berlin's historic landmarks, is undergoing repairs. American tourists, following their Baedekers, have immediately upon their arrival here sought a view of the impressive arch—only to find it hidden by a mass of scaffolding. The Prussian goddess of victory, sitting atop the arch and for nearly a century driving her four-horse chariot towards the East, has been removed to a studio for repairs.

Hidden by Scaffold

Located at the end of the historic Unter den Linden, the Brandenburg Gate has been associated with all important phases of modern German history. Napoleon rode through it after his victories over the Prussian armies, 120 years ago.

Sixty years later the Prussian army marched through the pillars of the gate, returning triumphant from the Franco-Prussian War. Later, the field-gray regiments passed through its shadow, reviewed by the Kaiser; to return four years later, defeated and disheartened, and to be received by President Ebert with his famous "defeated but not vanquished" utterance.

Has Bullet Marks

Afterward the tide of revolution passed over the gate leaving it scarred with bullet-marks. Then it witnessed the funeral procession of the late President Ebert and the triumphant entry of President Paul von Hindenburg.

Traffic now flows through its wide archways unceasingly. But the middle arch is never used. The asphalt covering is gray and dull,

'CLEVEREST' DRY AGENT BREAKS UP BIG WHISKY RING

Youth, by Two Years'
Daring Detective Work,
Causes Arrest of 250.

SEATTLE, June 4.—To young man of 23 years, who only a few years ago had visions of becoming a great inventor, goes the credit for one of the most daring and clever pieces of detective work in the history of prohibition enforcement.

For Alfred H. Hubbard, almost single-handed, has smashed the great rum running ring of the Pacific Northwest.

He emerges from the mazes and intricacies of this gigantic conspiracy with a tale so thrilling that it rivals the wildest imagining of the fictionist. Not even Sherlock Holmes was ever called upon to enact a more ingenious role, and the derring-do of D'Artagnan is matched in this story of a mere boy who pitted his wits and his nerve against a band

of super-criminals such as are known to only one craft—bootlegging.

Joins Rum Ring

And here is what Hubbard did:

More than two years ago he went to Washington with a "mystery motor" that he believed would extract energy from the sun's rays.

A short time later he appeared in the northwest. His knowledge of radio caused Roy Olmsted, convicted leader of the rum runners, to employ him to build a radio broadcasting station.

Hubbard so won the confidence of Olmsted that he was made his first lieutenant in the daring game of smuggling liquor down the coast from foreign ships anchored near the Canadian coast.

Hubbard, on this position by his bravery, because he volunteered for the most dangerous trips of the rum runners.

Delivers Booze

He delivered large quantities of liquor by truck and boat. More than once he was chased by other Federal and State agents, unaware of his identity. Shots from their rifles came mighty close to him several times.

Hubbard's next move was to in

clude Olmsted to allow him to keep the books of the rum runners. Secretly, he kept a duplicate set for the Government and learned of

money passing to corrupt officials. Three times he was arrested and stayed in jail for several days.

For nearly two years he carried his life in his hands and then he sprung his coup. No one was more surprised than State and Federal agents who had been working on the same case.

250 Indicted

And now more than 250 people have been indicted as the result of Hubbard's daring work, including police officials, sheriffs, coast guard officers, a naval aviator, steamship captains, business men and speed-boat skippers.

It was Hubbard's knowledge of science that really enabled him to work into the inner circles of the rum ring. Radio broadcasting station KFQX at Seattle, which he built

was one of the best-known stations in the Northwest. The story is told—though never proved—that through this station Mrs. Elsie Olmsted, wife of the rum king, broadcast code signals to rum boats in the Puget Sound region.

She told bedtime stories as "Aunt Vivian" to an appreciative audience of children, and it was whispered, to daredevil men shoving speedboats south from Canada.
