

HUGE BIOGRAPHY BEING PREPARED

Contains Histories of 20,000
Former Congressmen.

WASHINGTON, June 4.—The biographies of 20,000 former Congressmen, representing the entire past membership of the House and Senate, are being embodied in book form by Ansel Wold, clerk of the joint congressional committee on printing.

Wold has been engaged in his gentle task for several years and has written thousands of letters and made thousands of inquiries. He has considered it his duty to complete careers of the former members after they left Congress.

One of the most interesting careers unearthed by Wold was that of Senator James Shields, a native of Ireland, but who represented three States during his career—Illinois, about 1849, then Minnesota, whence he came back to the Senate, and finally California, which State he also represented.

Wold also has discovered that former Representative William Crapo of Massachusetts is the oldest living ex-member of the House. Crapo is 97. He served four years in the House, retiring in 1883, or forty-three years ago.


MOTHER'S WORK

GIRL SCOUTS SAY CIGARETS ARE O.K.

European Leaders Approve Use of Smokes.

Those who did were European delegates to the International Girl Scout convention at Briarcliffe, N. Y., who spent several days here as guests of local and State leaders.
