

VACATIONISTS TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF STATE PARKS

Conservation Department
Expects Record Attendance July 5.

With approach of the warm season, thousands of vacationists are shuttling back and forth along the principal highways of the State and an appreciable increase in attendance at the different State parks has been noted by the State conservation department.

On the strength of early reports from the park superintendents, a record attendance was predicted by Richard Lieber, director of the conservation department. With the Fourth of July coming on Sunday this year, the following day has been set aside for the usual celebration, allowing a full two-day period for the observance. This arrangement, which seems to have been generally agreed to by employers, will enable the pleasure seeker to enjoy a complete rest and outing at one or another of the six State parks in operation, Lieber pointed out.

Varied Scenery

In its string of six parks, Indiana has about everything to offer in the way of picturesque scenery. While no single park is lavish in its share of scenery, each possesses something of the ordinary, from trees four centuries old to rocky canyons cut hundreds of feet deep through walls of solid stone.

McCormick's Creek Canyon State Park, nearest to Indianapolis, has unusual facilities for the entertainment of children, in addition to its natural scenic beauties for the older folk. In one of the deeper canyons a bathing pool has been constructed for the children and nearby is a fully equipped playground, operated under the direction of a trained supervisor.

Haven for Wild Life

McCormick's is widely known as a haven for wild life, especially birds, and is rich in its assortment of growing plants and trees, making the reservation a rendezvous for naturalists. Only two hours' motor ride from Indianapolis, McCormick's probably will be heavily patronized over the Fourth.

For a longer Fourth of July trip, there are such resorts as Turkey Run park, directly west of Indianapolis, in Parke County, and Clifty Falls, near Madison. Each can be reached in a five-hour drive at moderate speed. Turkey Run is noted for its deep gorges and heavy growth of virgin timber, while Clifty is famed for its picturesque falls, its precipitous hills and its unparalleled panoramas, which takes in the Ohio river and Kentucky's hills beyond.

Hotel at Dunes

Three Lines of Cars Would Relieve Congestion, Says City Official.

The additional traffic lines will al-

low much more rapid clearance of traffic congestion, Mack said.

Cars now stationed at a forty-five degree angle project an average of from ten to twelve feet into the street, it has been estimated.

Would Ban Turns

Mack proposed an additional step to the tentative ruling against parking on Monument Circle, suggesting that right and left turns be prohibited at Market and Pennsylvania Streets, to prevent the long lines of cars that now often extend around the Circle.

Mack said he found flat-to-curb parking was considered a success in Chicago, where he inspected regulations a few days ago.

Eliminate Delay

"Indianapolis must get away from the idea of a one-line-of-traffic city," said Mack.

"With two or three rows of cars moving simultaneously, a great deal

of delay will be eliminated and many minutes will be saved."

The additional restrictions on downtown parking will tend to discourage the driving of cars to work by persons whose employment is in the business district, it is believed. Many now park their cars all day. This tendency would mean expansion of business for the Indianapolis Street Railway Company, Peoples Motor Coach Company and for the downtown garages maintaining parking places.


