

PICK CANDIDATES, DRAFT PLATFORM

Prohibition Party Reaffirms
Liquor Stand.

The Prohibition party was revived in Indiana today with candidates in the field for all except judicial positions in the Government to be filled by ballot in September. Nomination of candidates, adoption of the State platform, and evolution of a plan to circulate petitions to get the candidates' names on the ballots was made at a meeting of prominent prohibitionists Thursday at the Chamber of Commerce.

The Rev. William H. Harris and Dr. Albert Stanley, both of Indiana, were nominated for the long and short term magisterial offices respectively.

Other nominees: Secretary of State, Robert Dyer, Lapel druggist, treasurer, Mrs. Margaret M. Nold, South Bend; auditor, John Wirt, Frankfort dentist; superintendent of public instruction, Floyd E. Bechtel, of Indiana Central College faculty; clerk of Supreme and Appellate Courts, Mrs. Etta Miller, Indiana-pols.


The platform flayed the dominant parties for neglect in their obligations in law enforcement, and declared for the reading of at least twelve verses from the Bible in the schools daily, radical reduction in public officials' salaries and against the use of tobacco. It reaffirmed the party's position on liquor, asserting it "is the greatest curse of mankind with not a single truthful thing being said in its favor."

WOMEN LAUDED FOR RELIEF WORK

Pennsylvania Aid Com-
mended in Report.

New records in helpfulness and service were established last year by the Women's Aid of the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Pennsylvania Railroad, of which the Indianapolis' division has more than 2,000 members, according to a report of Mrs. W. W. Atterbury, director and Mrs. Ellisha Lee, associate director. Mrs. W. C. Downing is head of the local organization.

During 1925 the women workers, consisting chiefly of wives, daughters, mothers and sisters of Pennsylvania Railroad employees, visited 27,272 railroad families, giving assistance where required in the form of money, medical attention, food, clothing, fuel, flowers, fruits and other delicacies to the sick or injured, the report stated. The figure was an increase of 8,743 over last year.

In carrying on the work \$109,360 was expended.
