

# VIVE LA ORLEANS, IS CRY RINGING IN STREETS OF PARIS

'Long Live the Queen,'  
Shouts Throng as Duch-  
ess Rides By.

PARIS, Aug. 13.—"Long live the queen—long live the queen of France!"

Young men doff their hats as this cheer echoes through the Paris streets. The cheer is for a smiling lady dressed in mourning, driving along in an open carriage.

There are those who take very seriously this street tribute to Princess Isabelle d'Orleans, Duchess of Guise. They think the time soon is coming when the 50-year-old republic will be overthrown and the country will go back to monarchy.

Jean Pierre, Duc de Guise, would mount the throne as Jean III, should this day come. He now is the head of the House of Orleans and Bourbon.

## Feeling of Disgust

France is in a bad way. She can't get her currency straightened out, for one thing. Throughout the country a great feeling of disgust is being manifested towards the politicians who run Parliament.

The "Action Francaise," Royalist newspaper, unceasingly proclaims that the only solution to French troubles is to have a king. And even good republicans privately admit they fear the growth of the royalist sentiment.

In the army, the church, and in high society distinct royalist leanings crop out from time to time.

It's among the working classes in the big cities and the small peasant farmers that republicanism most strongly persists.

## Duke of Orleans

When the Duke of Orleans died some months ago, the Duc de Guise at once became the pretender to the throne.

The government hinted to him thereupon that he no longer was welcome on French soil. As a result he now lives in Brussels.

His lovely wife has remained in Paris, however. Her salon is one of the most frequented in the capital. She works unceasingly for the advancement of her husband's interests, and young royalists have made it part of their duty to give Princess Isabelle an ovation whenever she appears on the streets. They serve as cheer leaders, and many bystanders join in.

No woman has so charmed the boulevard crowds since Empress Eugenie was at the height of her youth, beauty and power.

## IMPORTANT YEAR IN THEATER LIFE

Austrian Amusement Houses  
Celebrate Birthday.

VIENNA—This year marks an important milestone in Austria's theatrical life.

During April the Burgtheater, formerly the Imperial Court Theater of the Hapsburgs, celebrated its one hundred and fiftieth birthday. During June the Theater an der Wien, Vienna's leading operetta theater, staged a series of special performances in honor of the one hundred and twenty-fifth anniversary of its foundation.

Theater an der Wien means the theater on the Vienna River, this river being the small but crystal

clear stream which flows through the city. Since the day when it was built by Emanuel Schikaneder with money which he had earned as librettist of Mozart's "The Magic Flute," this theater has occupied an internationally important and most unique position among the stages of the world.

It was in the Theater an der Wien that Beethoven's "Fidelio" made its debut before a most critical audience in November, 1805. Also it was here that Franz Liszt gave his first pianoforte recital at the age of 11. From this theater Maria Jeritza started her operatic career.

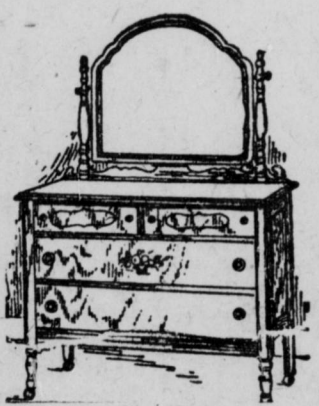
