97 Indiana Farmers Have  
Fields Inspected for  
Certification.

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Aug. 13.—Ninety-seven Indiana farmers have had fields or wheat inspected for certification under the direction of the Indiana Corn Growers' Association during the summer of 1926. More than half of those fields have already been certified by the certification committee of that organization which met Aug. 2, at Purdue University and inspected the threshed samples that had been received by that date.

J. W. McCarty of Evansville, B. W. Widney of Columbia City, Roy Caldwell of Camden, Frank Banta of Franklin, Ralph Holman of Hope, E. Robbins and K. E. Beeson of Purdue University, chairman, comprise the committee.

Both field and sample inspection are carried on under the direction of the Indiana Corn Growers' Association and its report of certified seed growers is being distributed to members, and to all interested parties. This list can be obtained from county agents or from the chairman of the committee at Lafayette.

Rudy, Michigan; Amber, Fultz, Trumbull, Michikon and Purkoff are the varieties certified this year. Purkoff, a comparatively new wheat developed at Purdue University, has been inspected on sixty-nine farms throughout the State. This wheat varies in color and hardness with

soil, seasonal conditions and fertility conditions. It is outstanding in its winter hardiness and high yielding ability. The qualities of the older established varieties are sufficiently well known to justify their use.

While a second certified seed list will be published by September 1, after all samples have been received, yet the first report shows over 10,000 bushels of high quality seed, wheat free from noxious weeds

and disease and showing very little mixture or loose smut.

Soybean and corn growers interested in certification are sending in their applications which should be filed by Aug. 15.


