Let Mr. Fixit present your case to city officials. He is the Times representative at the city hall. Write him at the Times.

Weeds, weeds, weeds! Mr. Fixit's mail is filled with requests from readers for assistance in getting weeds cut on vacant lots near their homes.

There is now no official machinery for obtaining cutting of weeds except in cases where the complainant provides Mr. Fixit with the names and addresses of the owners of the weedy lots. In those instances, the board of health will order the cutting.

In all other instances, the complaints are referred to the streets superintendent's department and turned over to a private citizen, who charges a fee for the work to the lot owner.

At the request of the streets department, Mr. Fixit is giving the name of this weed cutter. He is Foster Bell, 2542 Columbia Ave., phone Kenwood 4271.

Six Trunks of Martyr's Letters
Given Library of Congress.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—Six trunks of President Lincoln's documents are bequeathed to the Library of Congress under the terms of Robert Todd Lincoln's will, on file in Probate Court here. The papers are believed to contain valuable data on the Civil War President. Under the terms of his son's will, however, they can not be made public until 1947.

Robert Lincoln left his entire estate to his widow. A portrait of Abraham Lincoln, now in the Lincoln home here, probably will be given to the Government for the White House, it is understood.

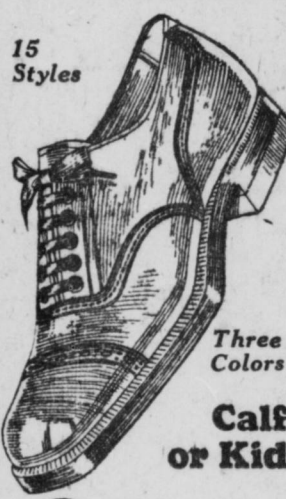
