

REPORT JEWELRY STORE, DIAMOND RING ROBBERIES

Four North Side Homes
Burglarized — Police
Hunt Thief.

Theft of diamond rings valued at \$1,450 from three homes, and jewelry valued at \$700 from a jewelry store, and four north side residence daylight robberies Wednesday were investigated by police today.

Police sought a Negro, believed to have stolen a bicycle and to have committed two daylight robberies and failed in another attempt.

Description Same

Description given police by the missing man's wife corresponds with that given by Kenneth Bann, 14, of 2426 Kenwood Ave., who told police his bicycle was stolen from the alley near his home. The man wore a khaki suit, he said. The burglar answered the same description.

RAIN NINTH DAY RECORD FOR CITY

Since Aug. 11 some rain has fallen every day here, Meteorologist J. H. Armitong said. This is thought to be a record for the summer season in Indianapolis.

And more rain is predicted. The forecast is for partly cloudy weather tonight and Friday, with local thunderstorms probable.

Ground all over this section of the country is practically saturated, as a result of the continued precipitation and farmers, who earlier in the season were praying for rain, now wish that the downfall would cease. Crops that should be maturing, instead are growing, and staying green. Wheat and oats in the shock, especially in the northern part of the State, are beginning to sprout and considerable damage may result if the rain does not cease.

PRINCE IS MURDERED

Thief Slays Italian Nobleman Re-lated to Yank Family.

ROME, Aug. 19.—Prince Umberto Ruspoli, scion of one of the oldest families among the Roman nobility, was assassinated Wednesday night near his cottage at Genzano when a caught a thief attempting to rob his home.

The murdered Prince was the brother of the late Prince Alessandro Ruspoli, who married Virginia Berry, a celebrated heiress from Georgia, soon after her marriage, nearly thirty years ago, the American Princess purchased the historic castle on Lake Nemi, where Lord Byron once lived and wrote. Under Italian law the property passed to Alessandro, who, dying, willed it to his brother, Umberto. The Princess contested the will and recovered the castle in which she now lives, although the grounds were allotted to Umberto and he had a cottage there.
