

DETOURS PASSING, STATE HIGHWAY BULLETIN SHOWS

Intensive Construction Is
Bringing Results—Re-
ports on Condition.

Results of intensive construction work undertaken this season are beginning to show, it was pointed out today in the State highway commission's traffic bulletin. In the last few days detours and run-arounds had been removed as follows:

Bridge on Rd. 10 opened one mile south of Sullivan; 4-mile detour lifted on Rd. 11, because of paving repaired south of Alexandria and new bridges completed one mile south of Albion and one and one-half miles

north of Columbia City on the same highway.

Maintenance forces have completed application of tar and asphalt to Rd. 13, between Waterloo and Angola and road is open. A new bridge is in service on Rd. 21 one mile north of Decatur, eliminating a detour.

Detour Bridge Collapsed

The bulletin called attention to a bridge which collapsed on the east bound detour, carrying traffic around the Putnamville railroad overhead construction on the National Road. Until a temporary structure can be built, all traffic will use the route formerly intended for west bound

detour as follows:

No highway was reported as follows: Paving between Plymouth and Peru, with separate detours marked for north and south; between Peru and Plymouth; bridge at Edinburgh under construction; closed for paving between Marion and Salem; and between two towns marked; these detours are rough and narrow in places.

Bridge to bridge construction traffic is using company bridge

and local roads; detours marked; watchman handles traffic by stop and go signals; drive slowly over one-way

run-around at bridge construction one mile east of Cambridge City. Traffic to the north bridge at Putnamville, traffic detour north on No. 32, proceed three miles north to Marion, then to Marion Road at Eatontown; dangerous Monon Railroad crossing on detour near Putnamville; closed for culvert bridge at Pennsylvania Railroad crossing east of Bradford.

No. 6: Detour marked four miles north of Lebanon; short detour two and one-half miles northeast of Thornton; detour at Shelbyville; closed for culvert construction nine miles north of Madison; detour marked.

Many Detours

No. 12: Short detour in Bicknell due to city construction work; drive carefully to city construction work; bridge three miles north of Gosport.

No. 15: Under construction from La Porte to Kinsman; bridge across the river from Dear Creek to end of pavement south of Logansport.

Martinsville and Bloomington, except for three-mile detour two miles north of Martinsville, which is officially open, some shoulder work remains to be done, and public travel road at its end is closed; bridge at Marion; Martinsville and Rushville; detour marked for local traffic; Indianapolis to Rushville and Marion; closed for paving between No. 638 to National Rd. (No. 31) at Dunrath; thence west to Indianapolis; road closed for paving between Indianapolis and Marion; detour marked; local traffic; short detour one-half mile northwest of Salem.
