

MAYOR MOVES TO END SQUABBLE OF SANITARY BOARD

Drafts Letter Concerning Disposal Plant Fight—No Hearing on Ross.

Mayor Duvall intends to take a vigorous part in pacifying the warring members of the board of sanitary commissioners, it was indicated today.

Duvall is drafting a letter concerning the recent squabble over city sewage disposal plant management, which has split the board in two factions.

Expected Stand

Definite stand against refusal of Russell T. MacFall and City Engineer George G. Schmidt to authorize purchase of several thousand dollars worth of equipment that C. K. Calvert, acting superintendent, contends is necessary to complete the plant is expected to feature the letter.

However, it is believed that Duvall will express a vigorous objection to expenditure of large sums of money at the plant. MacFall and Schmidt say extravagance has characterized the plant's operation.


