

LEADERS REALIZE RUSSIA NOW AT FORKS OF ROAD

Shall She Mind Own Business or Shall She Launch World Revolt?

MOSCOW (By Mail)—Behind the Kremlin's mighty walls and towers something mysterious is going on, something that is shaping the whole future of Russia.

The city is full of whispered rumors. Red soldiers with fixed bayonets guard the tunnel-like gates under the towers and no one without the countersign is allowed to pass. It would be like having a Chinese wall about the United States Capitol and posting troops there to keep out the public while something, no one knew exactly what, went on inside, something that had to do with the future of the nation.

Forks of the Road

There is every reason to believe that the handful of men who now rule Russia realize the country has come to the forks of the road and are divided over which way to go.

Shall Russia consider herself merely the breeding ground and bridgehead from which to launch a world revolution?

Or shall Russia mind her own business, stick to her knitting and try to seize a come-back as a member in full standing among the world's great powers?

Schisms Results

That is one way of stating the question which has caused a schism in the ranks of the government and the Communist party.

One faction is fighting to maintain the Communist International and the Russian government as virtually one and the same thing. That is, they believe it the duty of Russia to make common cause with Communists the world over and aid in every way the overthrow of foreign, capitalist or bourgeois governments in favor of their own brand.

The other faction takes the position that Russia has already tried this experiment and failed. They contend that to pursue this road further may bring about the collapse of Soviet Russia itself. They urge, therefore, that Russia would do better to make communism a success at home and leave to others the task of revolutionizing their own particular corners of the world.

It is a conflict between those who have learned something by the practical experience of the past few years and those who have not.

realize that Russia needs and must have capital if she is to survive. They know that money is hard-boiled and that centuries of practice it has set up an international standard to which any individual or nation wanting capital must conform. Otherwise, it will not be forthcoming. Foreign trade and foreign relations generally conform to much the same standard, they observe, and whatever form of government Russia may choose to set up at home, these international requirements must be met.

Russia is now in full evolution, a process fully as important to her, to Europe and the world, as was her revolution of 1917.

The struggle may come to a head in October, if not before. At that time, or thereabouts, the Union Com-

gress of Soviets, the 1,500 delegates representing the entire Soviet Federation, is scheduled to meet in a two weeks' session and decide future policy.

Either she will try for a comeback by playing the international game as other nations play it, while governing herself in her own way at home, or else merge her government with the movement for a world revolution, and thus encounter the opposition and suspicion abroad which eventually would engulf her ruin.
