FIRE PREVENTION WEEK IS OPENED

Smoke Eaters Will Turn to Orators.

Firemen will turn orators this week.

In observance of Fire Prevention Week, which began Sunday, the smoke-eaters will address school children, while more than one hundred other firemen set about a goal of 30,000 inspections to be achieved during the next two weeks.

Frank C. Jordan, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce fire prevention committee, announced that four fire alarm boxes would be installed on downtown corners to demonstrate how to turn in an alarm, and that examples of good and poor roofing, safe and unsafe chimneys and other fire hazards will also be exhibited.

Meanwhile, Fire Chief Jesse E. Hutzell will superintend inspections of factory sprinkling systems.

MORE JUDGES URGED

Federal Judiciary Suggests Means to
Speed Justice.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 4.—Appointment of twelve more Federal judges; exercise of vigilance in dismissing cases which cannot be prosecuted, and caution against prosecution of insignificant violations of law were recommended today by leaders of the Federal judiciary as a means of speeding justice and making it more effective.

A report by the senior judges of the nine Circuit Courts of Appeal, adopted at a conference and made public by Chief Justice Taft, reported "substantial progress toward better conditions" and warned against overworking judges.

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Renick Named Deputy

Arthur C. Renick, 5338 Julian Ave., is the choice of Clarence C. Wyson, new State insurance commissioner, for the position of chief deputy. It was reported today. Renick will succeed Stuart A. Coulter, who resigned as chief deputy along with former Commissioner Thomas S. McMurray Jr.
